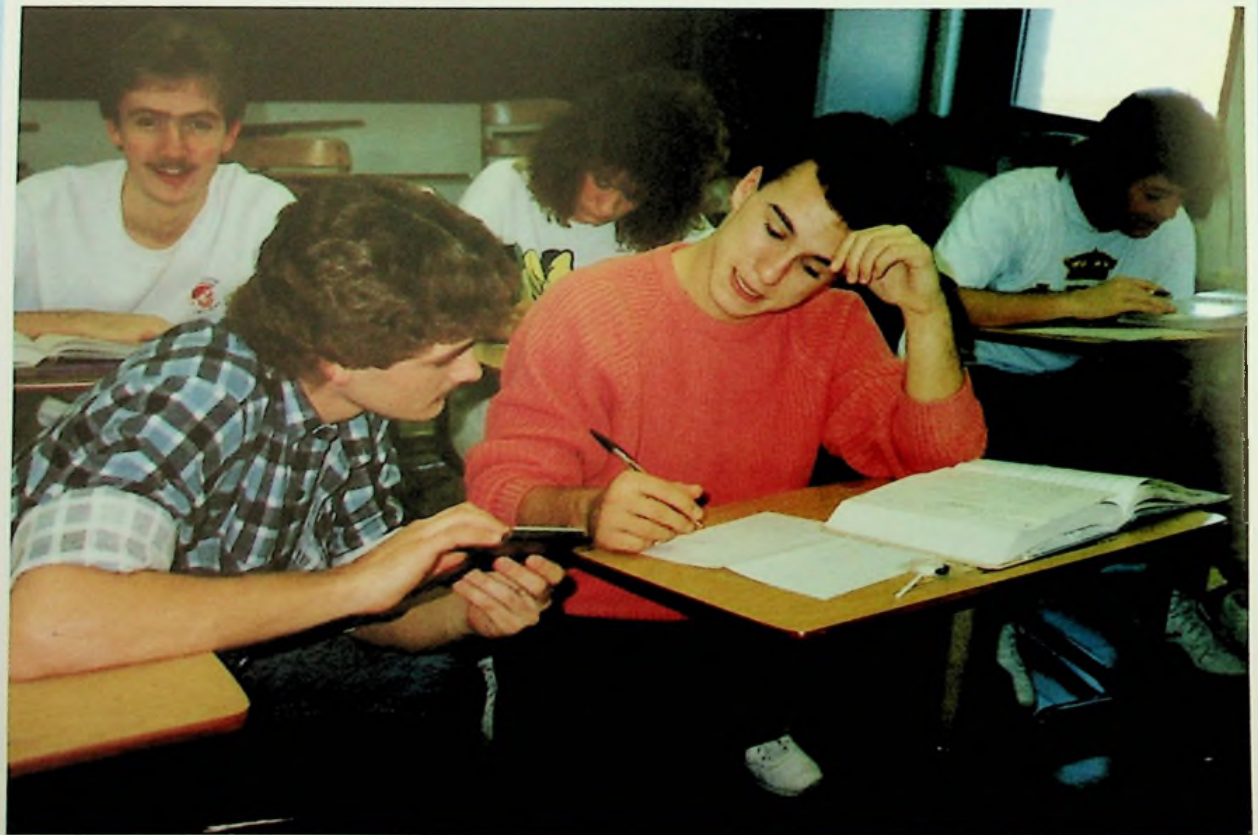

Thinking power is just not enough when it comes to specialized classes such as Home Economics, Industrial Arts, Accounting, Typing, and Occupational Work Experience. From learning the keys on the typewriter to the on-the-job training, students developed skills that can be used in later life.

Home Economics prepare both boys and girls for life on their own by teaching sewing and cooking. Occupational Work Experience and Occupational Work Adjustment provide job experience to those who plan on

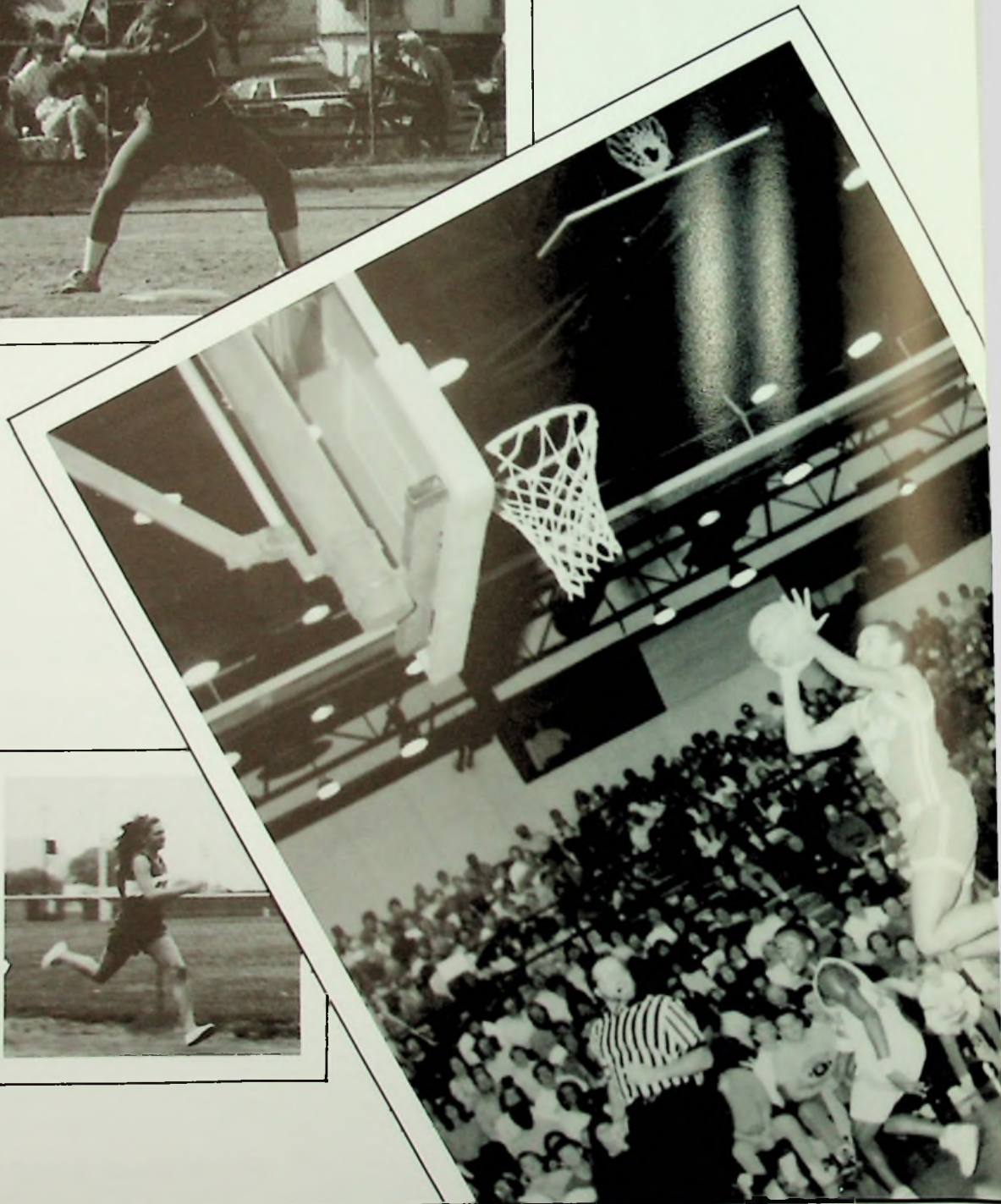

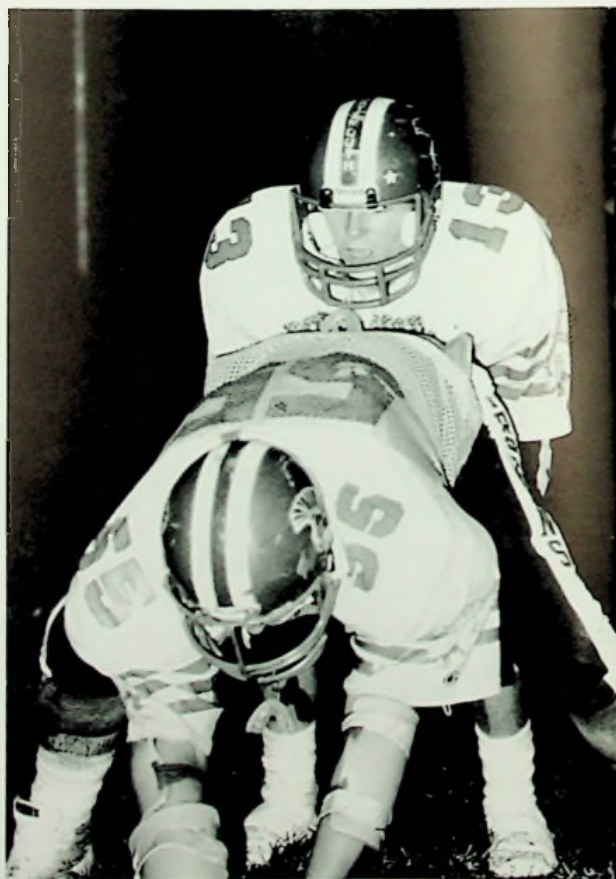

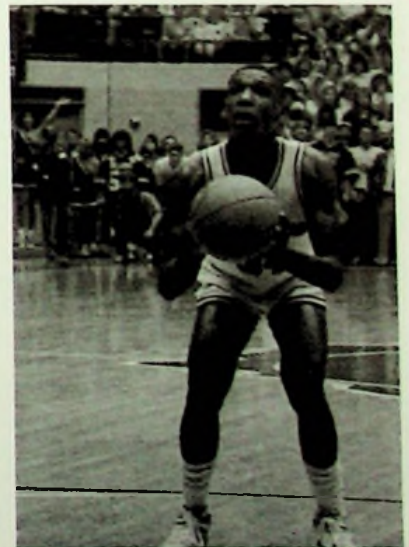

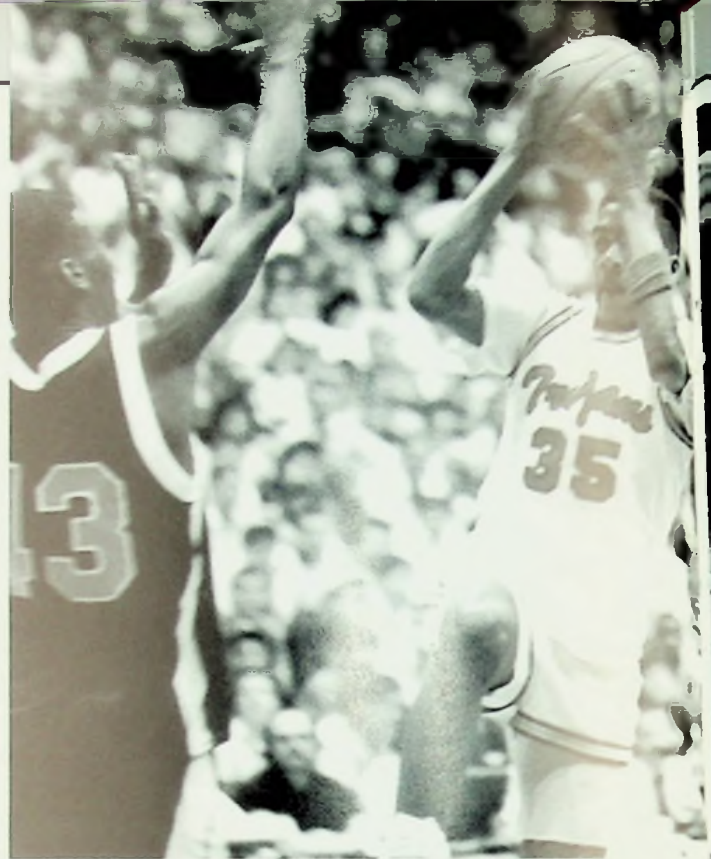

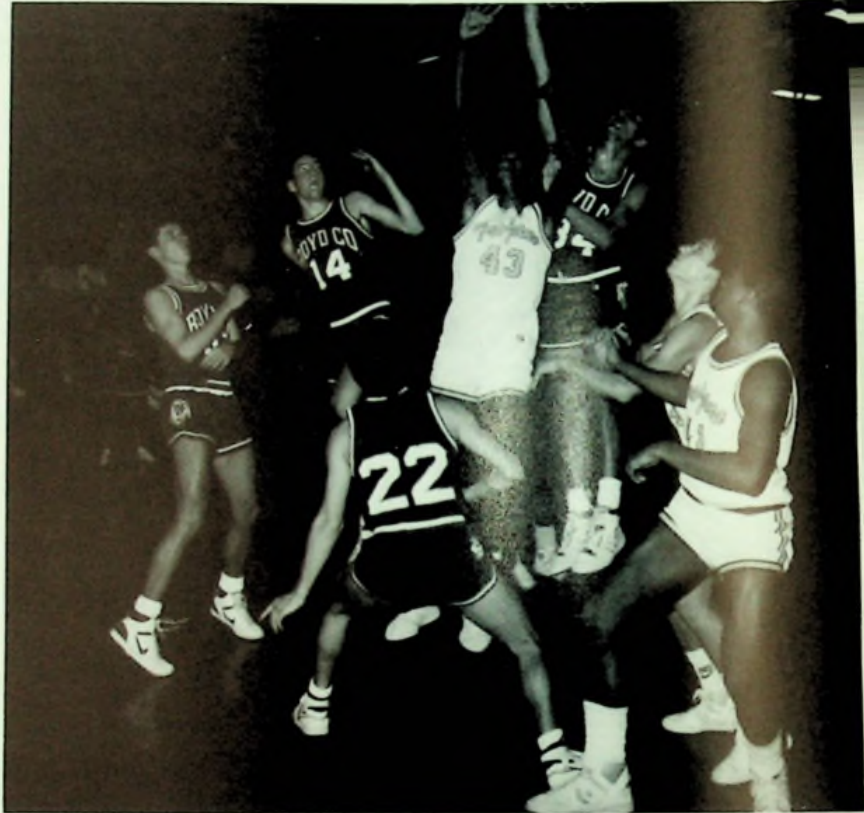
