





PRINCIPAL


A familiar face at G.H.S. is that of our principal: Mr. Raymond E. Hall.

The name of our Senior Class Play was "Peter Beware", given May 11, and May 12. It was directed by Miss Wheeler.




Again this year our football team received competent instruction from Joe Jenkins. His type of character is one which creates sportsmanship, determination, and teamwork in our players.


G.H.S. VS. B.I.S.

provided lively entertainment for an appreciative audience each night, May 11 and 12.


