We, the staff of the 1961 FALCON, are deeply honored to dedicate our yearbook to Mr. Mitchell.

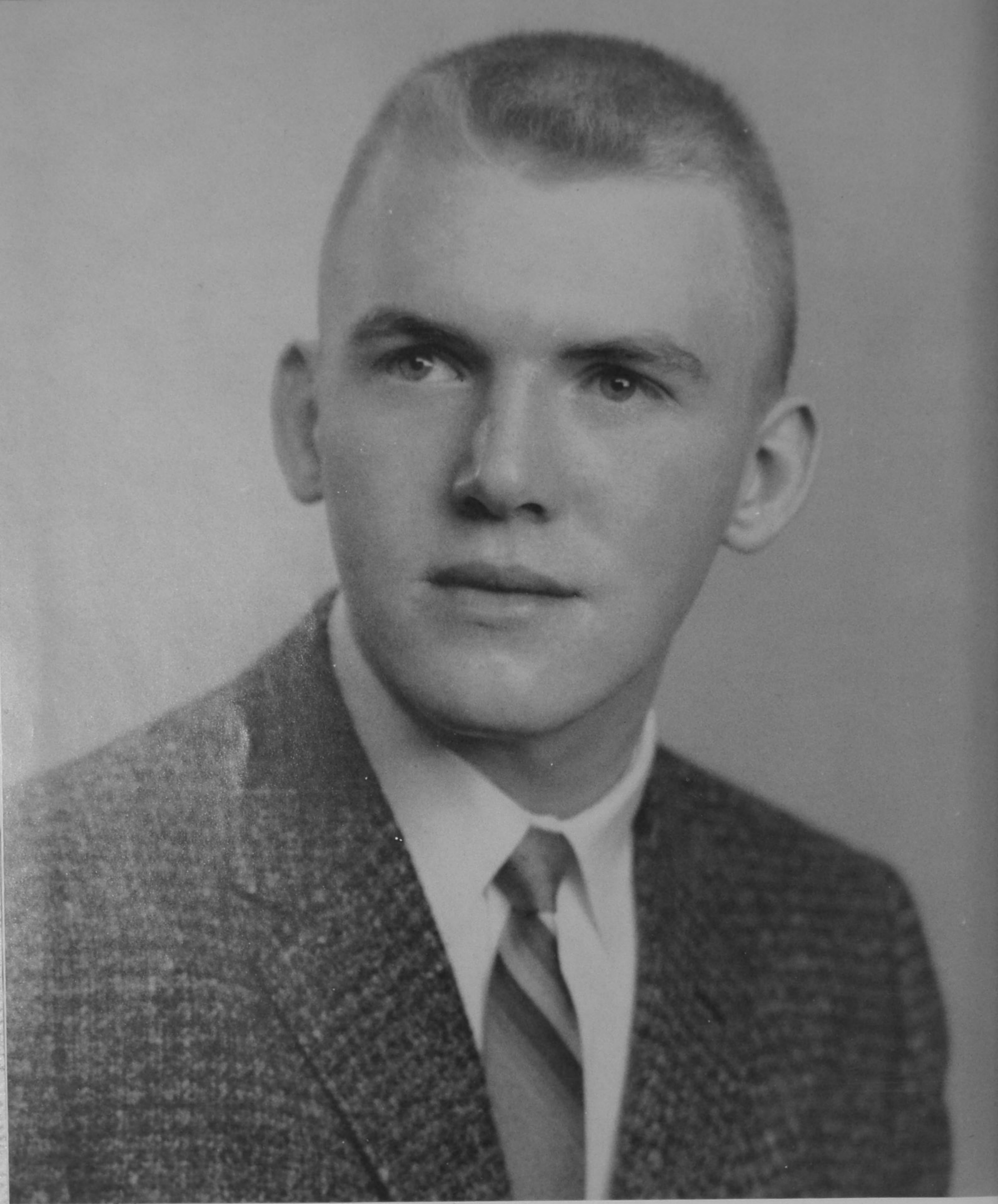


TWO TEMPLES

evil powers which are the enemies of youth.

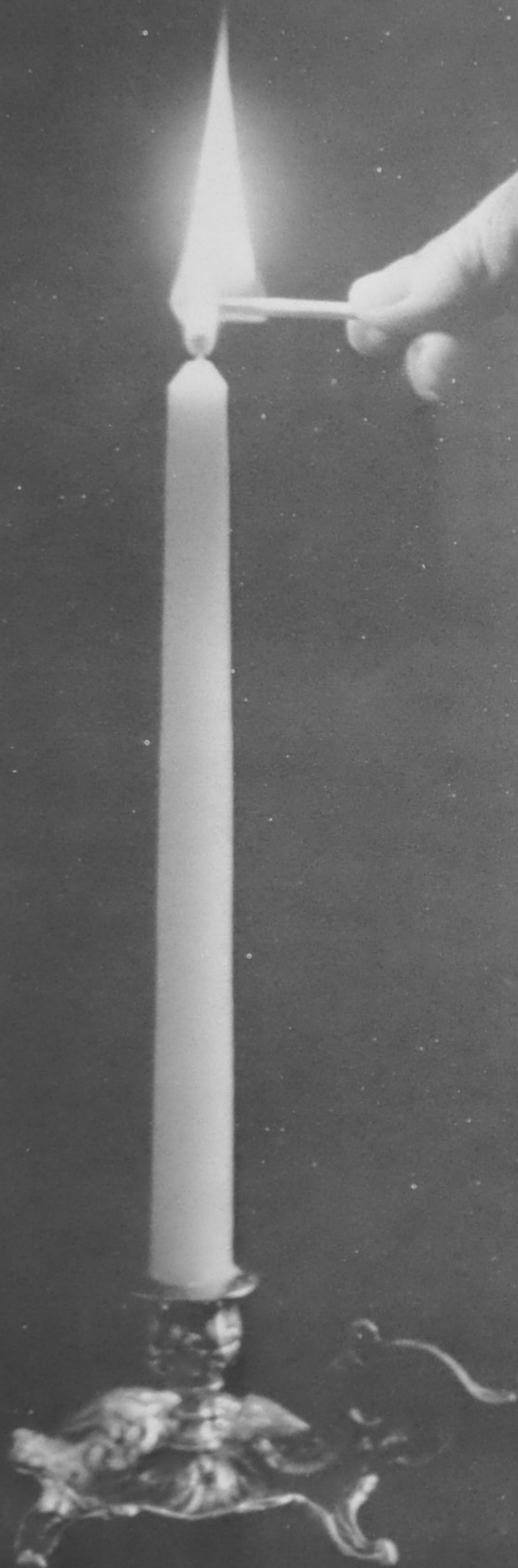
He awakens sleeping spirits. He quickens the indo-

French, Spanish, Dutch, Norwegian, and other Europeans settled in parts of what was to become the United States. But it was the English who came in the largest numbers. And it was the English who came to control the thirteen colonies that stretched for 1,500 miles along the Atlantic seaboard.

The Colonial Period

From the time of the first English settlement in 1607, the English colonies developed through long centuries of experience. Gradually, thought and action were directed toward the rights and duties of these beginnings.

of which are to be found today—county, borough, jury, sheriff, coroner, and justice of the peace, for example. And all of these were well known in England long before the first English settlement in America.

(1) *The Twin Concepts of Limited Government and Civil Liberties.* They brought with them, too, the twin ideas of limited government and civil liberties. That is, that government is limited in what it may do, and, especially, that it is limited in the sense

that each man has certain rights that government cannot injure or take away. These great principles of freedom were proclaimed in such historic English documents as the Magna Carta in 1215, the Petition of Right in 1628, and the Bill of Rights and the Act of Toleration of 1689.

(2) *The Concept of Representative Government.* A third vitally important concept brought to America in English ships was that of representative government. For centuries there had been developing in England the

DISTRICT STATE SCHOLARSHIP TEAM

New enthusiasm was shown by the high school students in the District-State Scholarship Test this year. Competition was keen in the Preliminary Tests to see who would be the two to take the finals May 6. We are in Division II, which entitles us to two in each subject matter field. The Ohio University District that we are in conducts the test at Portsmouth High School the first Saturday in May. Additional Preliminary and State Final Tests were purchased for review. The library was used a great deal. More books were taken home than usual.

Beginning with the General Senior Scholarship Test and including the State Eighth Grade Test and the Final District-State Test, the school has set up money prizes of \$25 for the first place, \$10 for second, and \$1 for third thru tenth place in the county, District, and State finals. Two students already this year have won top prizes of \$25.

TEST RESULTS

Out of 33 students from Minford taking the Final District-State Scholarship Tests at Portsmouth, 16 received certificates for placing in the district. Three of these also placed in the state. EIGHTH GRADE SCHOLARSHIP

The '60 Eighth Grade Test was used as a trial test prior to the '61 test. Students as a rule studied well. Teachers took a particular interest in them, including Mr. Wheeler, Mrs. Harper, Mrs. Borders, Mr. Collins, Mr. Jenkins, Miss Deemer, Mr. Bernard Bennett, Mr. Everling, and Mr. Duncan. New teachers with new enthusiasm joined with our veteran teachers to help. Consequently, our school was unusually successful, receiving 47 certificates - more than any other school in the county, placing first, and tying for seventh. This is the second straight year to be first in the county. Congratulations eighth graders! You are a good group. You did a good job.
