The class of '97 has shared many memories good and bad. With these experiences they have grown closer and grown up.






Mr. Joe Knapp Principal

### Making Our Futures Today











It took dedication and hard work to finish the 1996 SPIR-IT, but in the end we were rewarded by making the memories last.







With this group, consisting of 29 singers and dancers, 4 instrumentalists and 2 managers, they produced the sound's of the 70's.





The 1995-1996 marching band was a season of utmost success. The band competed in eight straight competitions receiving superior ratings at each and every competition.









## A Dynasty in the Making



















so quickly had been awaited for thirteen years. But these years we waited were not wasted years. Many friendships and memories arose during this period, ones that in our hearts we will hold forever.





The award winning Tartan marchers step to the beat as they look forward to the end of the parade. Each student on the trip had a great time and made memories that they will never forget.


