


er out of the ordinary. At East High, we are not merely acquaintances, we are friends. As an outsider can easily see here, "Everybody Knows Your Name."


Leaving Only Our Names


What's My Name?


Yet another year has come and gone, each day brings us closer to graduation day. Being the class of 2000 is a special task for us. We'll always be remembered as the "class of the millenium."

As sophomores we have had many new opportunities. We have been through driver's education and have found a new freedom that comes with a licence.


No longer the "little" freshmen, we hold our heads high and are ready to mark our names into the history of East High School.

We don't know what the future holds, but we will live for the moment and enjoy the friendships and memories we are making within the walls of East High School.



























Making A Name

As freshmen, we all encountered the joys of growing up and the hardships that go with it. But through these times, we found our names and grew closer together.









We Know How To Hit It






Rebuilding Our Name


Name That Tune!
