



Each boy and girl must analyze his or her own potentialities, interests, and ambitions to gain the ultimate goal of a successful career.

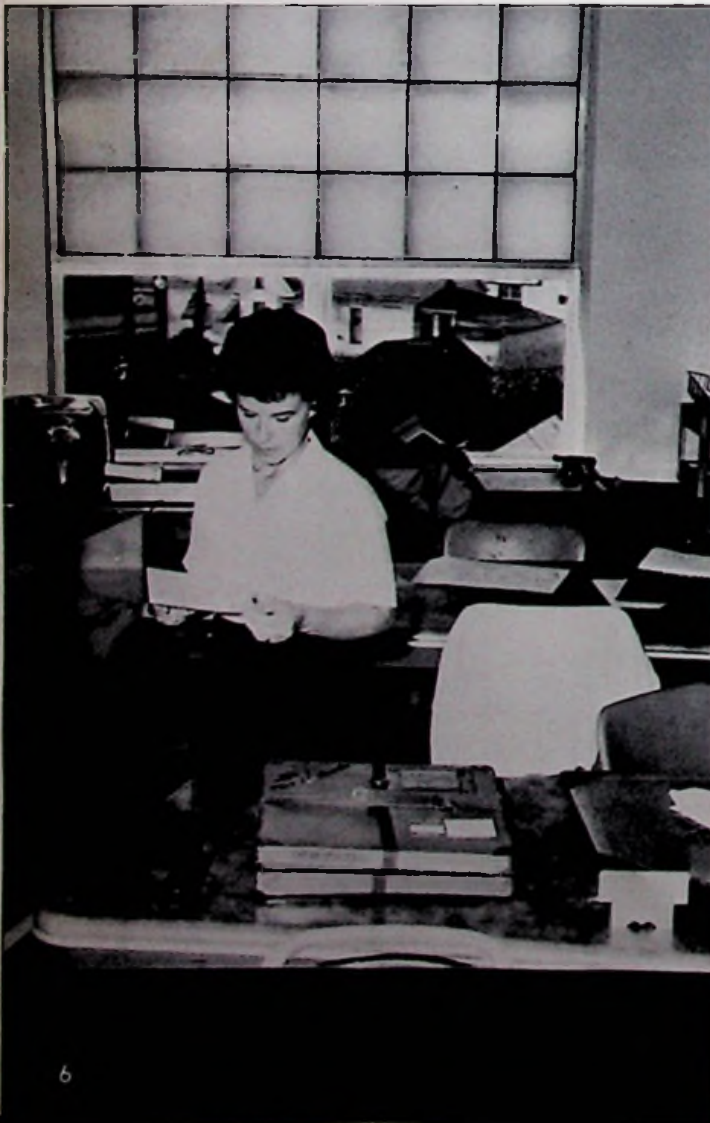

Class History

On September 7, 1960, sixty-nine nervous and excited students began their high school career. We elected as our first officers: Mary Canter, President; Melody Phillips, Vice-President; Ken Jones, Secretary; Melinda Jones, Treasurer; and Gary Dunn, Reporter. Led by Miss Williamson, Mr. Jenkins, and Mr. Lodwick, we immediately became involved in the work and fun which fill high school life. We chose Anna Sue Henson as our Homecoming Attendant. Our Annual King and Queen Representatives were Eddie Riggs and Pennie Hale.

Summer vacation over, we returned, ready but not too eager to begin our studies, but very eager to take part in the many activities which marked our sophomore year. Our President Debby Park and the other officers--Melody Phillips, Vice-President; Pennie Hale, Secretary; Beverly Keaton, Treasurer; and Melinda Jones, Reporter;--initiated a money-raising campaign. Busy with Hobo Days, car washes, and dances, we sixty-nine sophomores were advised by Mrs. Phillips and Mr. Jenkins. Janet Rice was chosen to represent us at the Homecoming festivities. Beverly Keaton and Jim Whitley were our candidates for Annual King and Queen.

The most exciting half of our high school life began in September, 1962. Mr. Jenkins and Mrs. Schisler were appointed as our advisers. Our officers were: Judy Briggs, President; Dave Lodwick, Vice-President; Pennie Hale, Secretary; Janet Rice, Treasurer; and Suzanne Cooper, Reporter. With the arrival of our class rings in October, we became the fifty-four most proud students at Glenwood. Our Homecoming attendant was Patty Tomlin. Our candidates for Annual King and Queen were Pennie Hale and John Shultz. On April 26 and 27, we presented our Junior class play, "Everything Happens to Us." Only one more major event was to come--the Prom which we gave in honor of the Class of 1963. The theme was "Apple Blossom Time." The music was supplied by the Ruth Beard Band of West Virginia.

At last we became Seniors. We elected Jack Spears, President; Dave Lodwick, Vice-President; Pennie Hale, Secretary; Janet Rice, Treasurer; and Faye Wickline, Reporter. The student body selected Anna Sue Henson to reign as Miss Tiger Touchdown of 1963. Our Senior attendant was Mary Canter. Carolyn Akers and Jim Gerard were elected as Annual King and Queen and were honored at a dance given by the National Honor Society. We presented our senior class play, "Off The Track," on Friday, March 13.

The biggest part of the year was spent raising money for our senior trip. At 7:00 on March 19, thirty-seven excited seniors left for Washington, D.C. We spent two wonderful days there and visited the Wax Museum, the Capitol Building, the Smithsonian Institute; climbed the steps of the Washington Monument; and took a memorable trip to the grave of the late President John F. Kennedy.

Then we boarded the bus for New York City where we spent four of the most fun-filled days of our lives. We visited the Statue of Liberty, the United Nations Building, Chinatown, Rockefeller Plaza, and we saw New York City at night from the top of the Empire State Building. Never will we forget our wonderful experiences; the walks down Fifth Avenue, the Taft Hotel, the wild subway rides, Times Square, the dividing line on the bus, the 2:00 curfew, and the house detective.

On May 21, the Prom was given in our honor by the Junior class. The theme was "Moon River" and the moonlight cruise was given aboard the Chaperone.

It was with mixed emotions that we walked the aisle at Baccalaureate and with tears in our eyes and smiles of triumph that we 49 seniors received our diplomas at Commencement on May 27, 1964. The day that for so long was only a dream is now only a memory and one that we will cherish forever.
