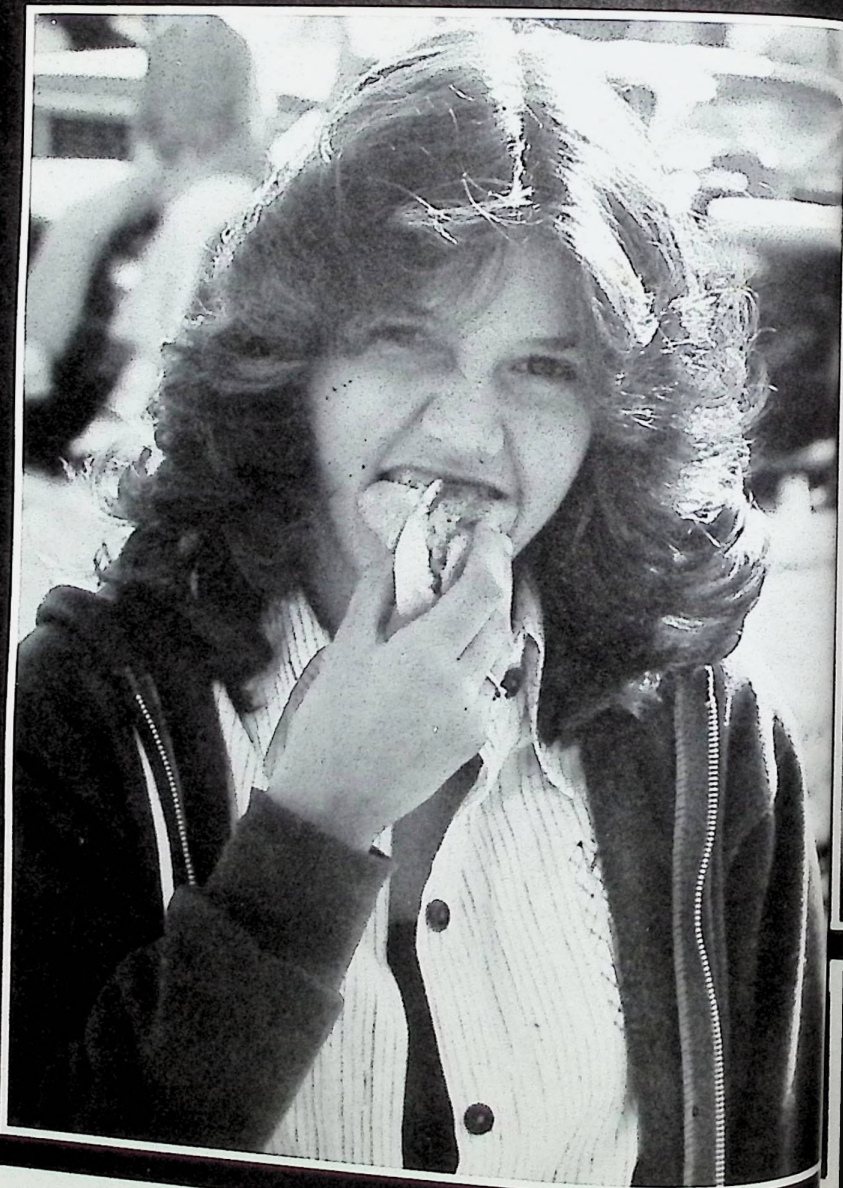
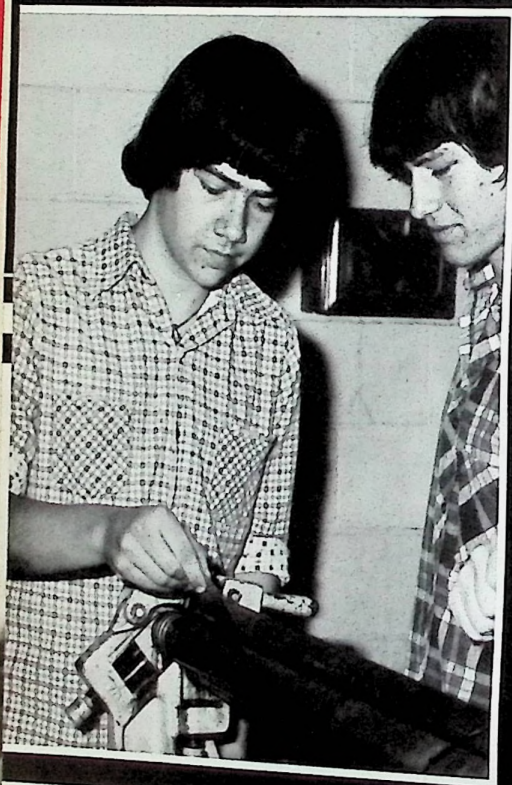


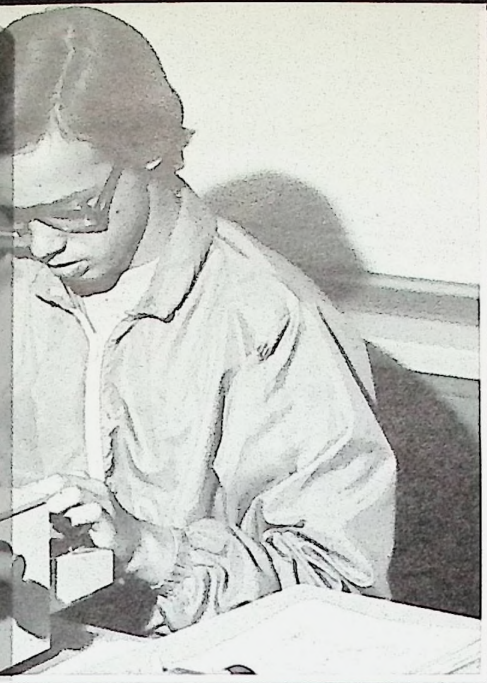
Pride is different things to different people. For some, it's studying super-hard; for others, it's making the team or perfecting band shows. For most of us, it's being part of a productive school.



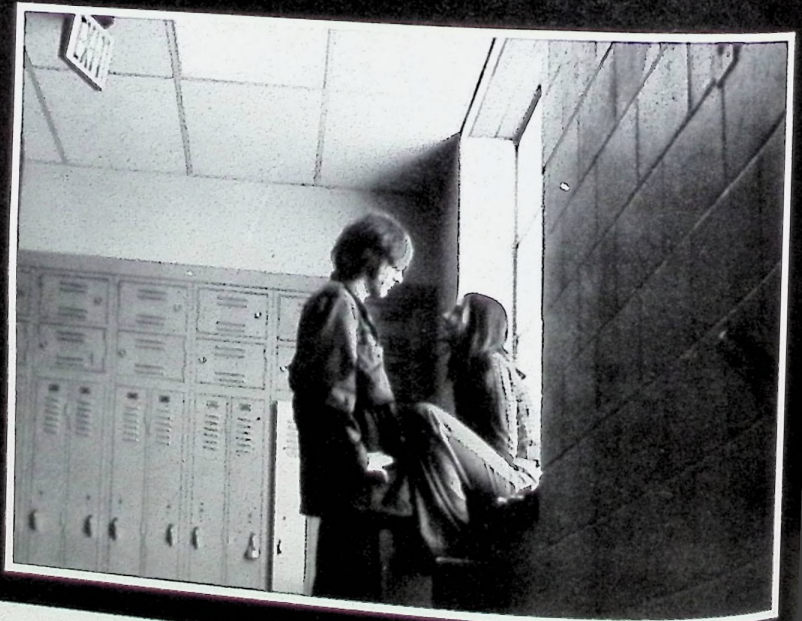


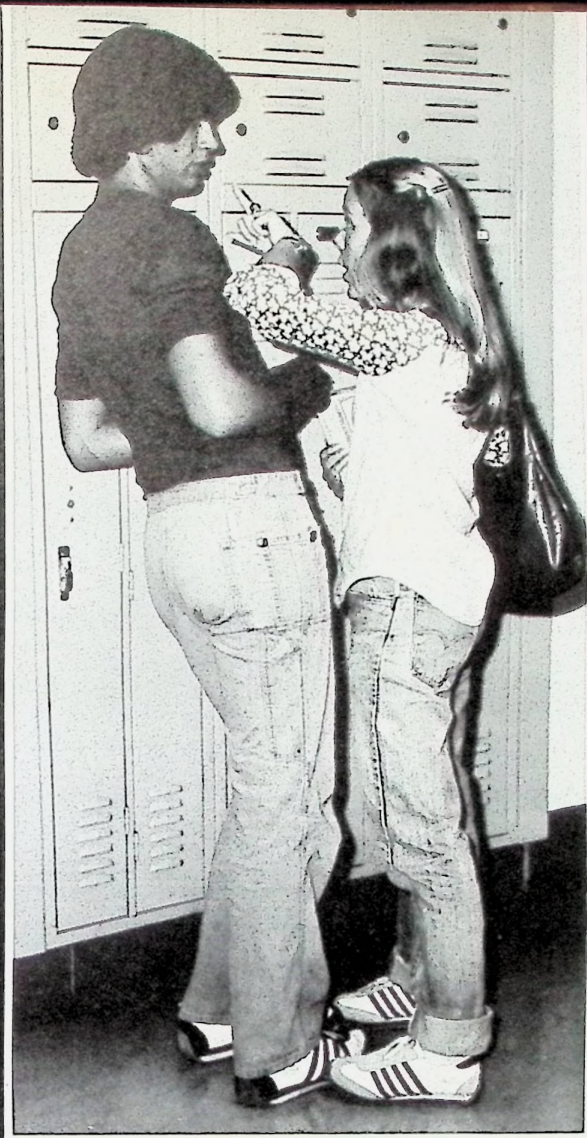
We spend a great part of our lives in this school. Each activity we participate in adds to our growth. And we, in turn, add to the growth of our school through our involvement.





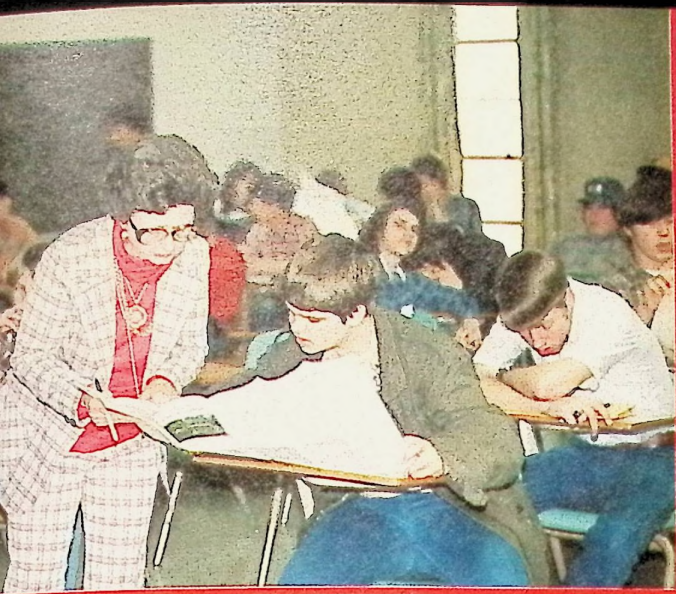
The social education we receive at school is just as important as our academic education. Our relationships with other people help us to grow more independent. If we as individuals grow stronger, our school will be stronger.

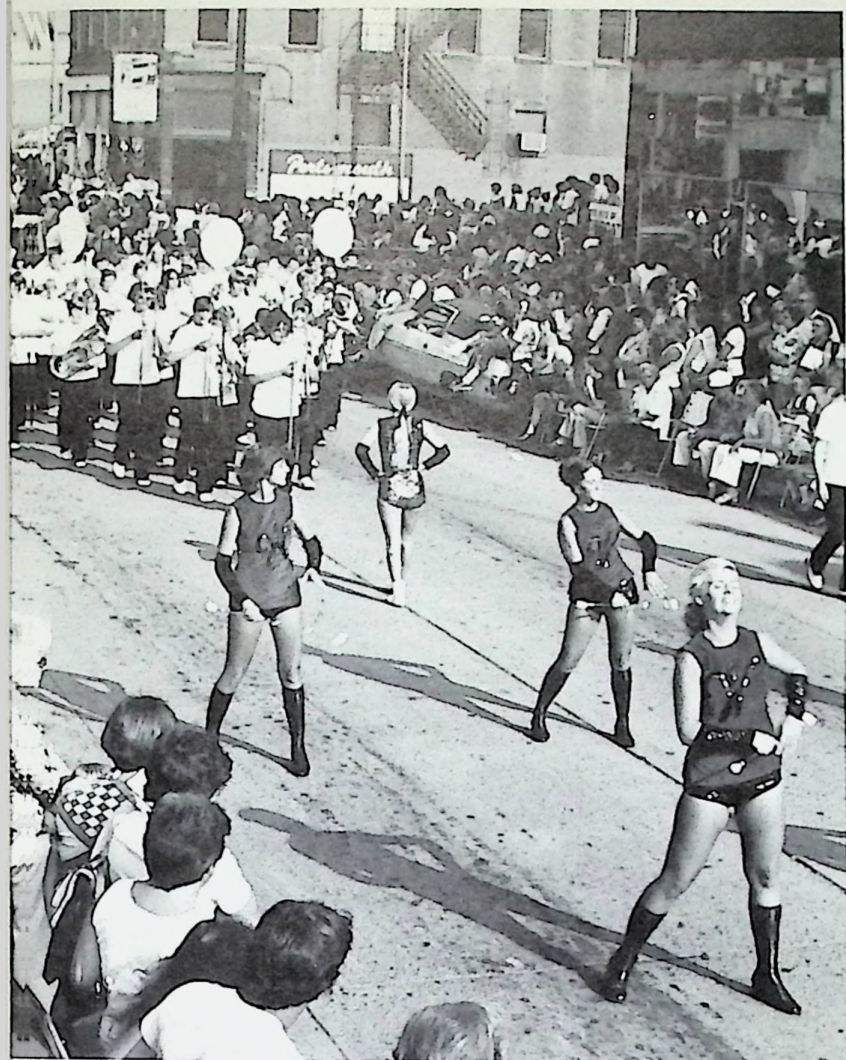


Dreams Come True for West Entries

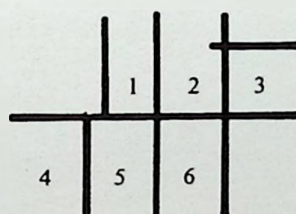

Our marching band, majorettes, and cheerleaders, making their season's debut, completed the West parade contingent.



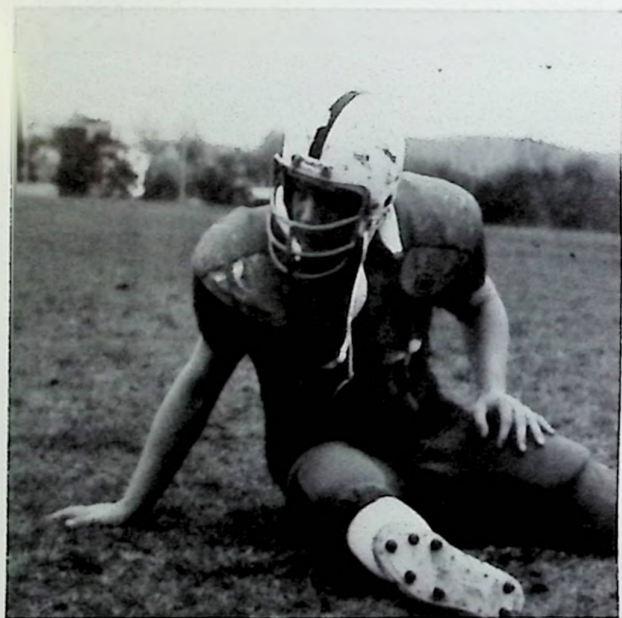

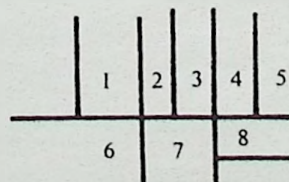
The feeling of "Jungle Love" was in the air. The name of the game was victory. The spirit of the crowd was high as they cheered the team to a homecoming win over Minford.

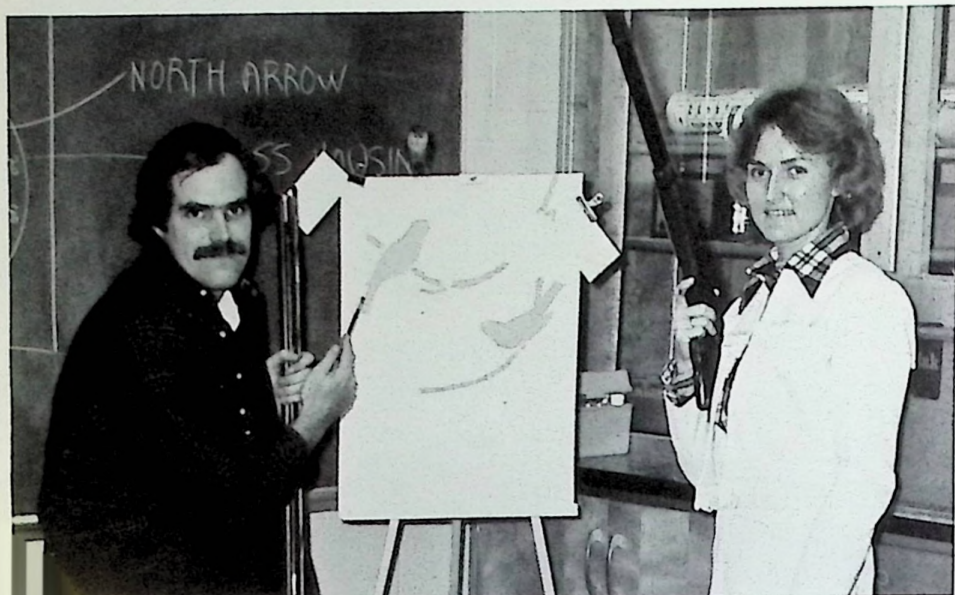
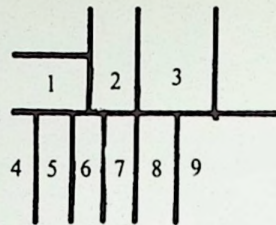

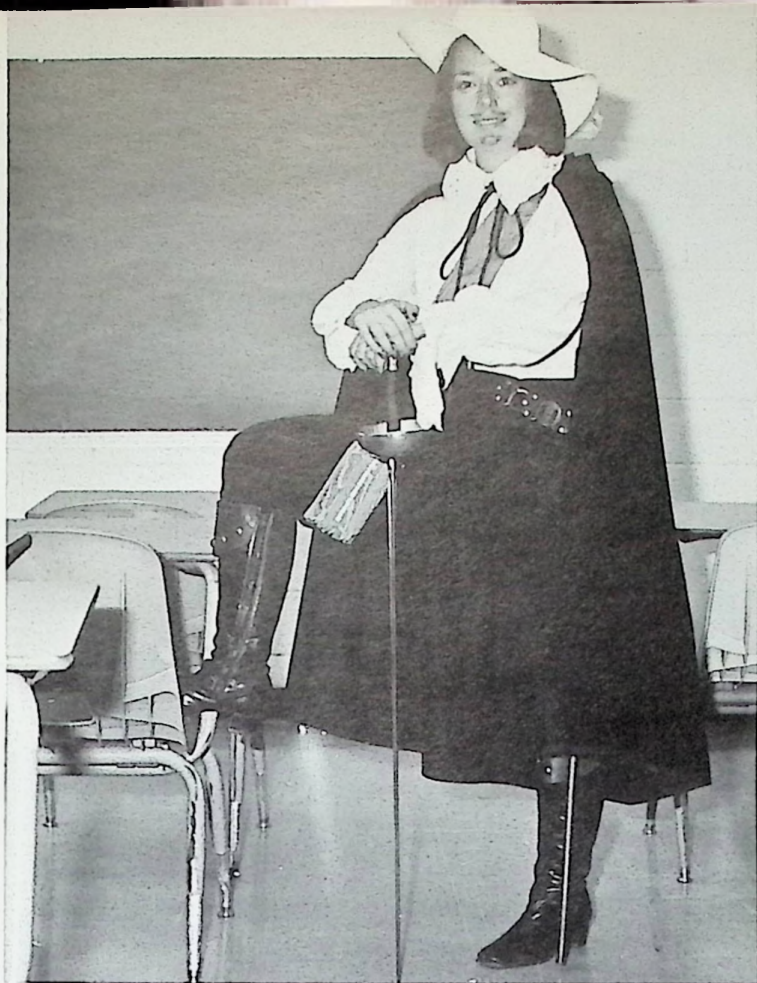

Teachers SCORE for Reading

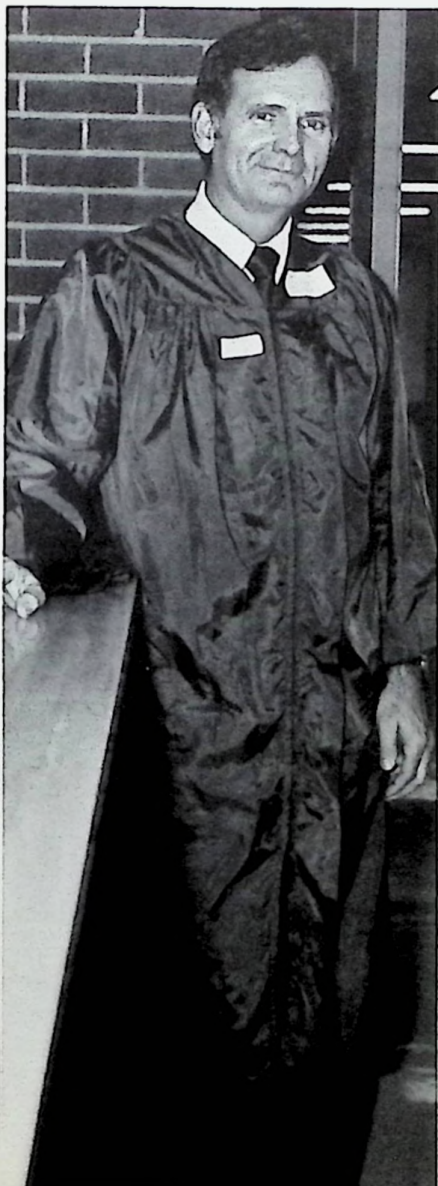
"Mr. Sayre's ears must be cold; he's had that toboggan on all day."

laughter and audience enjoyment triumped, and the seniors solved the case to applause.



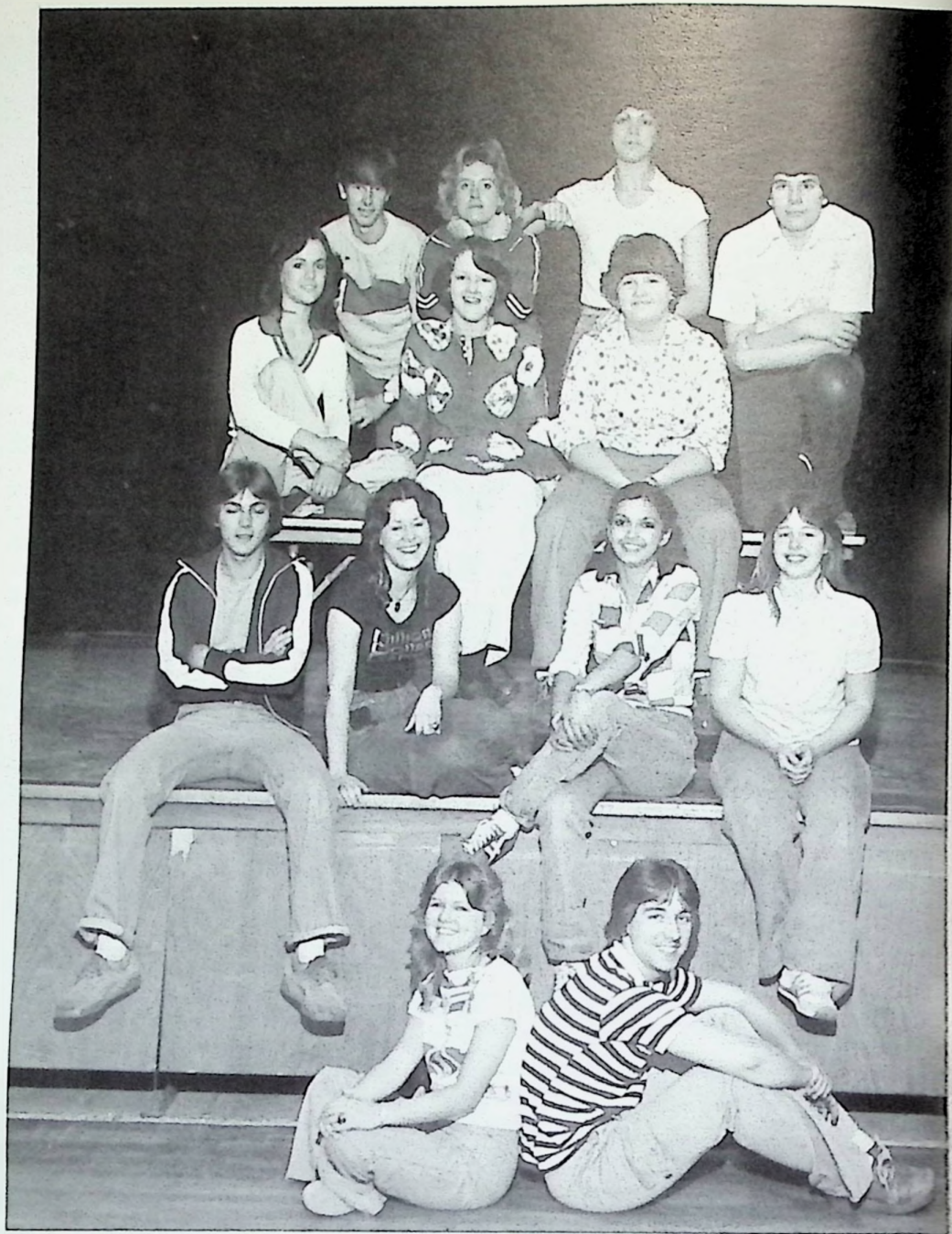

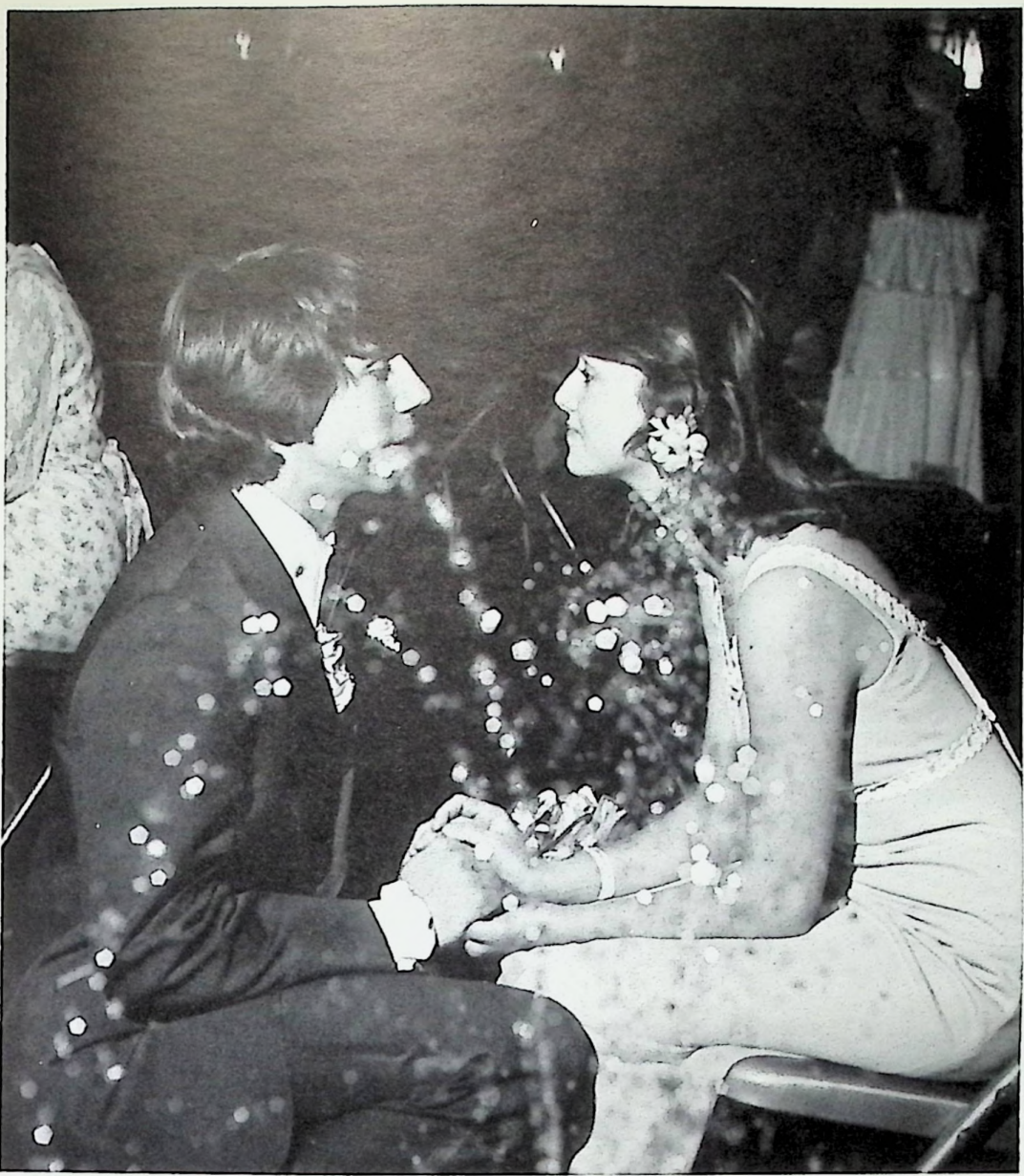


“Underwater Fantasy” Is Fabulous

Time to Move on

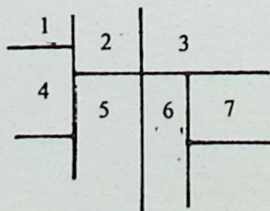

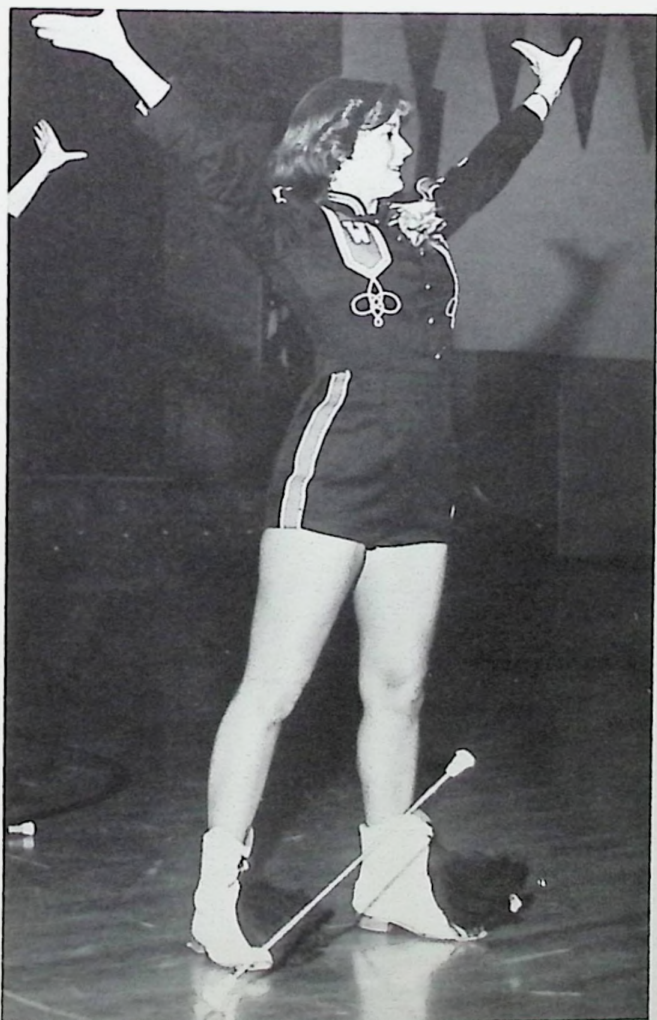
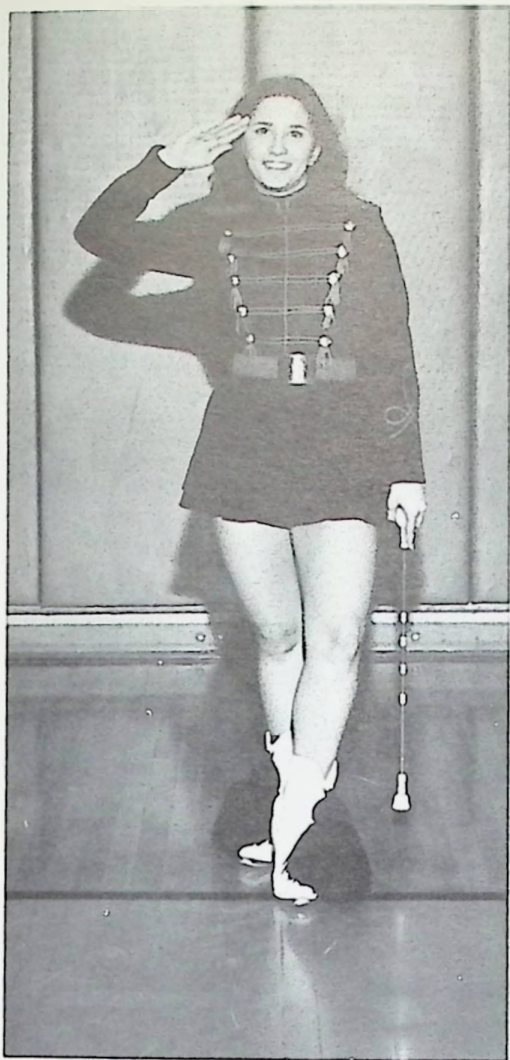




Perennial Crowd Pleasers

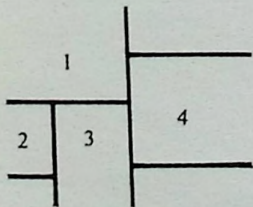
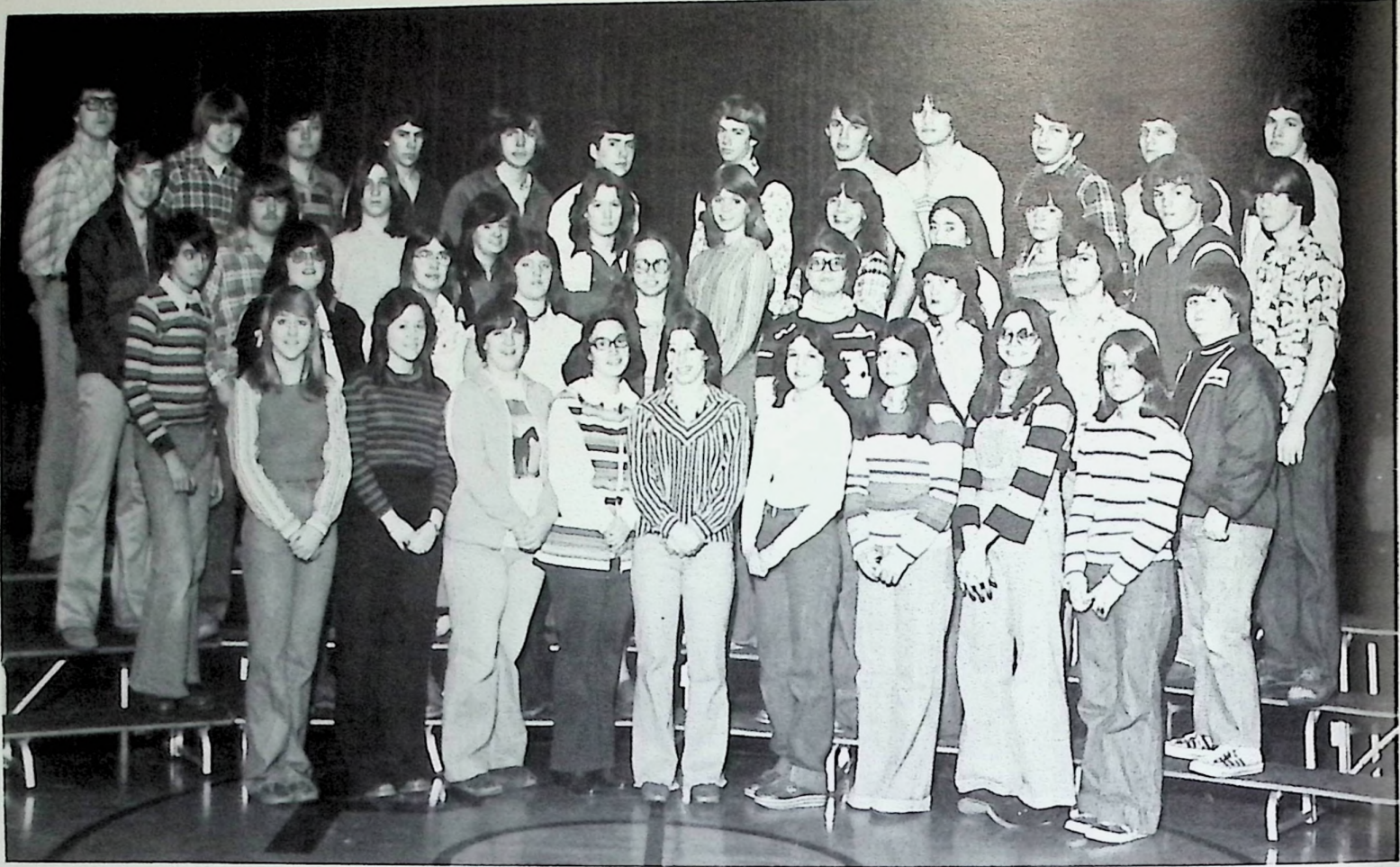




Seniors Musicians Honored

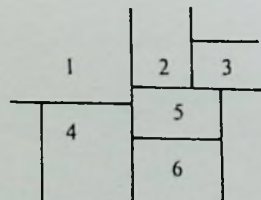


Trip Caps S.A.E. Year

Mrs. Goode and the Student Action for Education club came through for West again this year. As usual, the club deco-

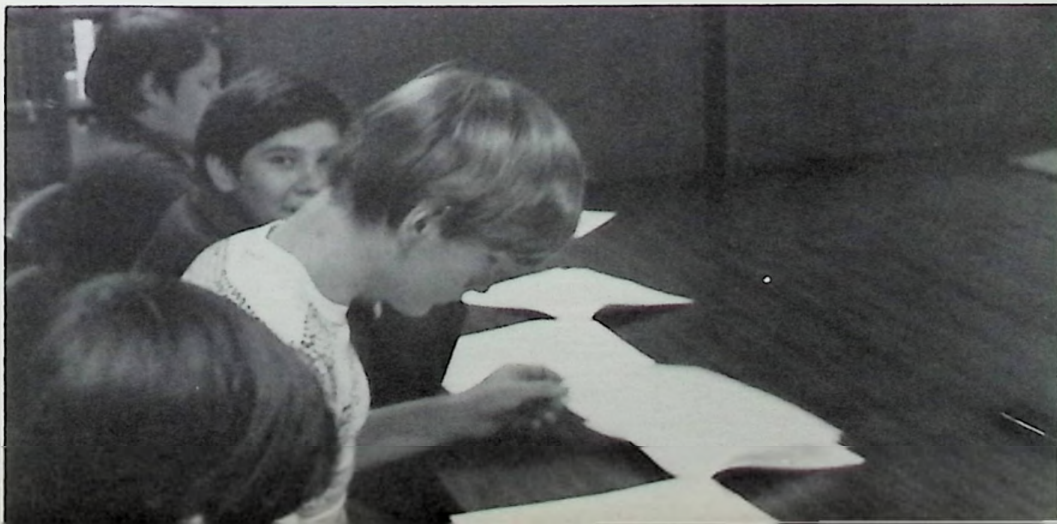
rated the school Christmas tree in the front lobby and sponsored Teacher Appreciation Day. As a reward for all

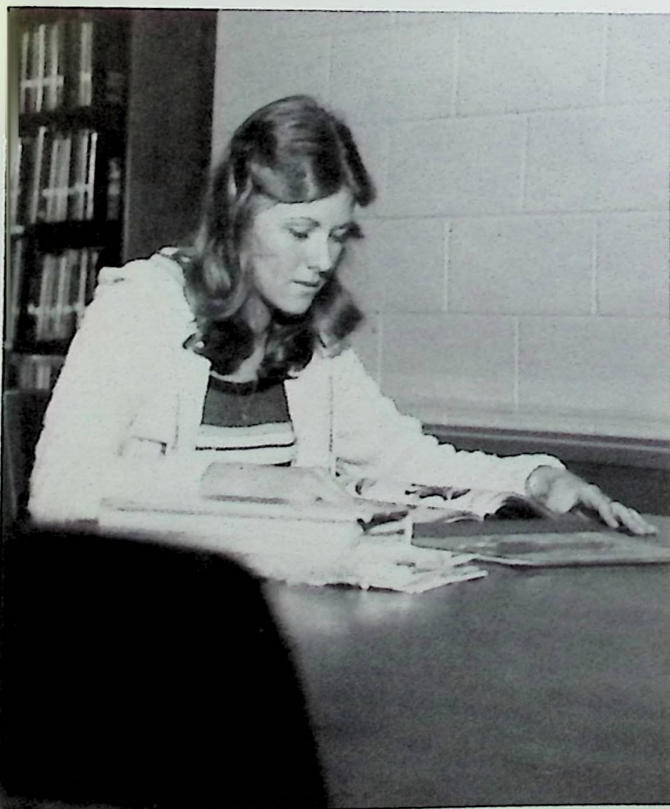

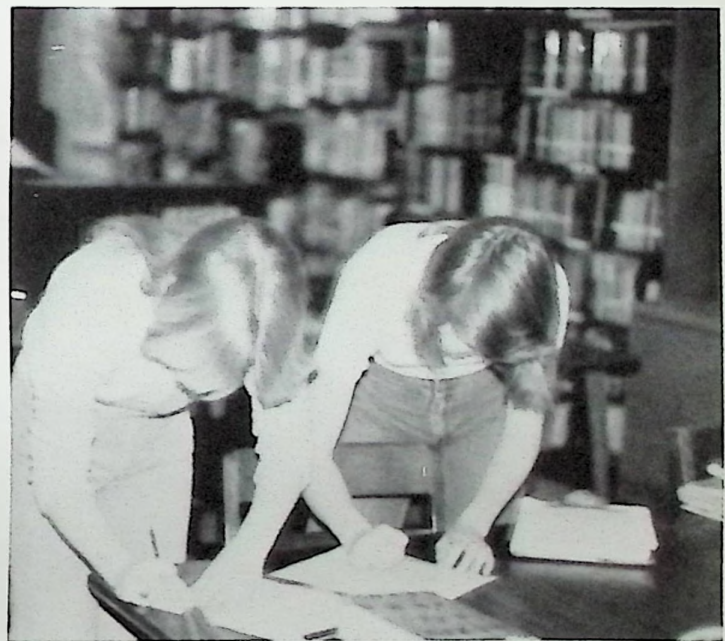
Mind Expansion

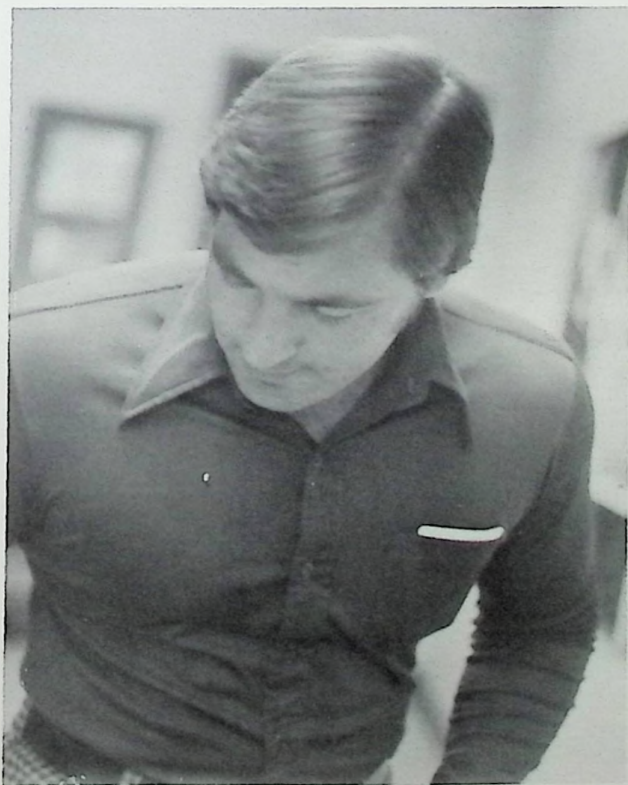
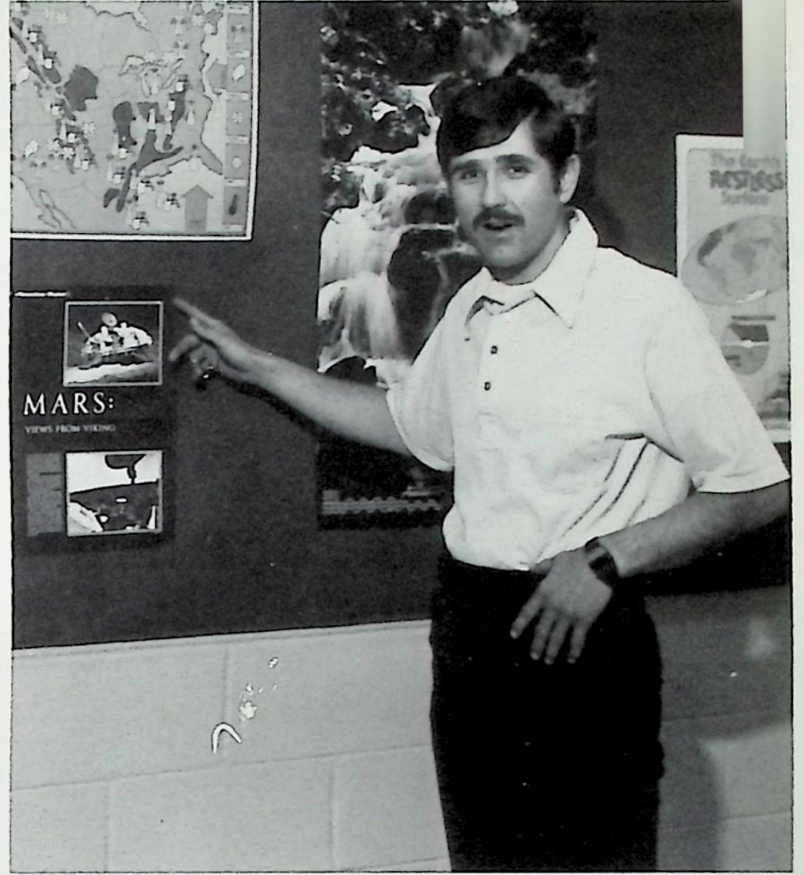
Experiments + Practice = Success

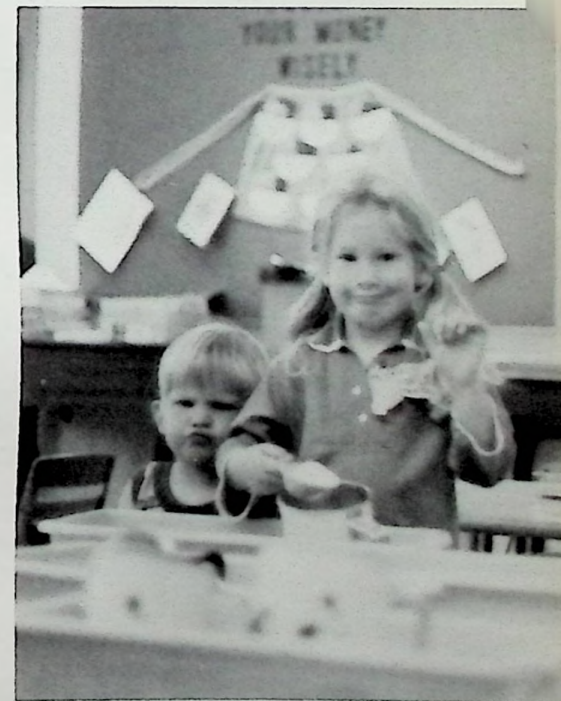


Vocational Arts

drafting, welding, and small motors as well as woodworking.

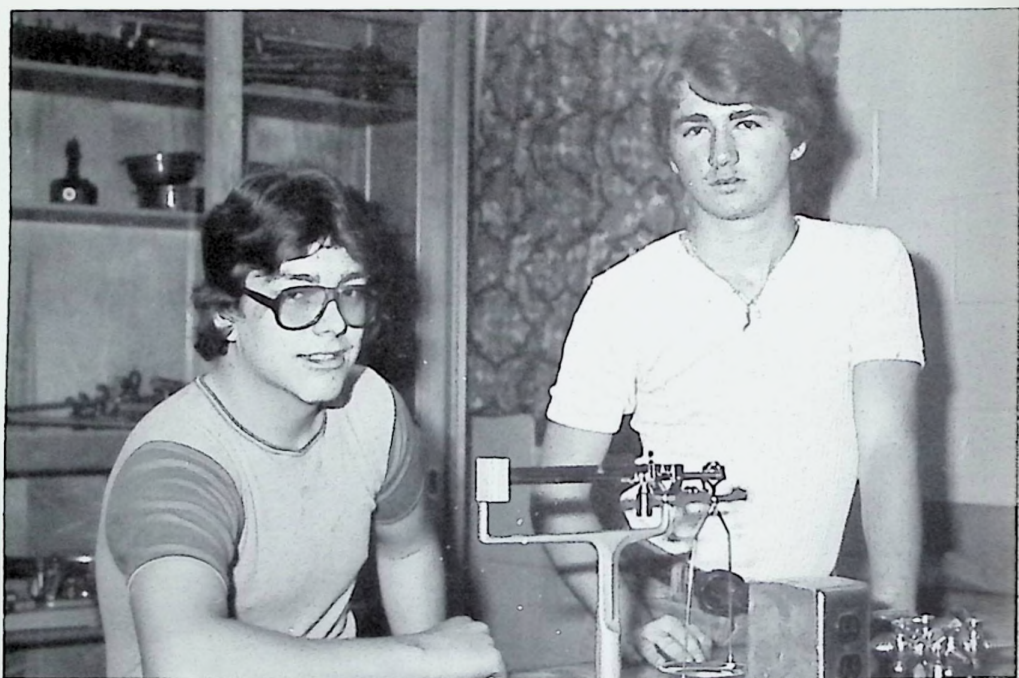

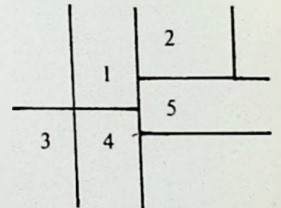
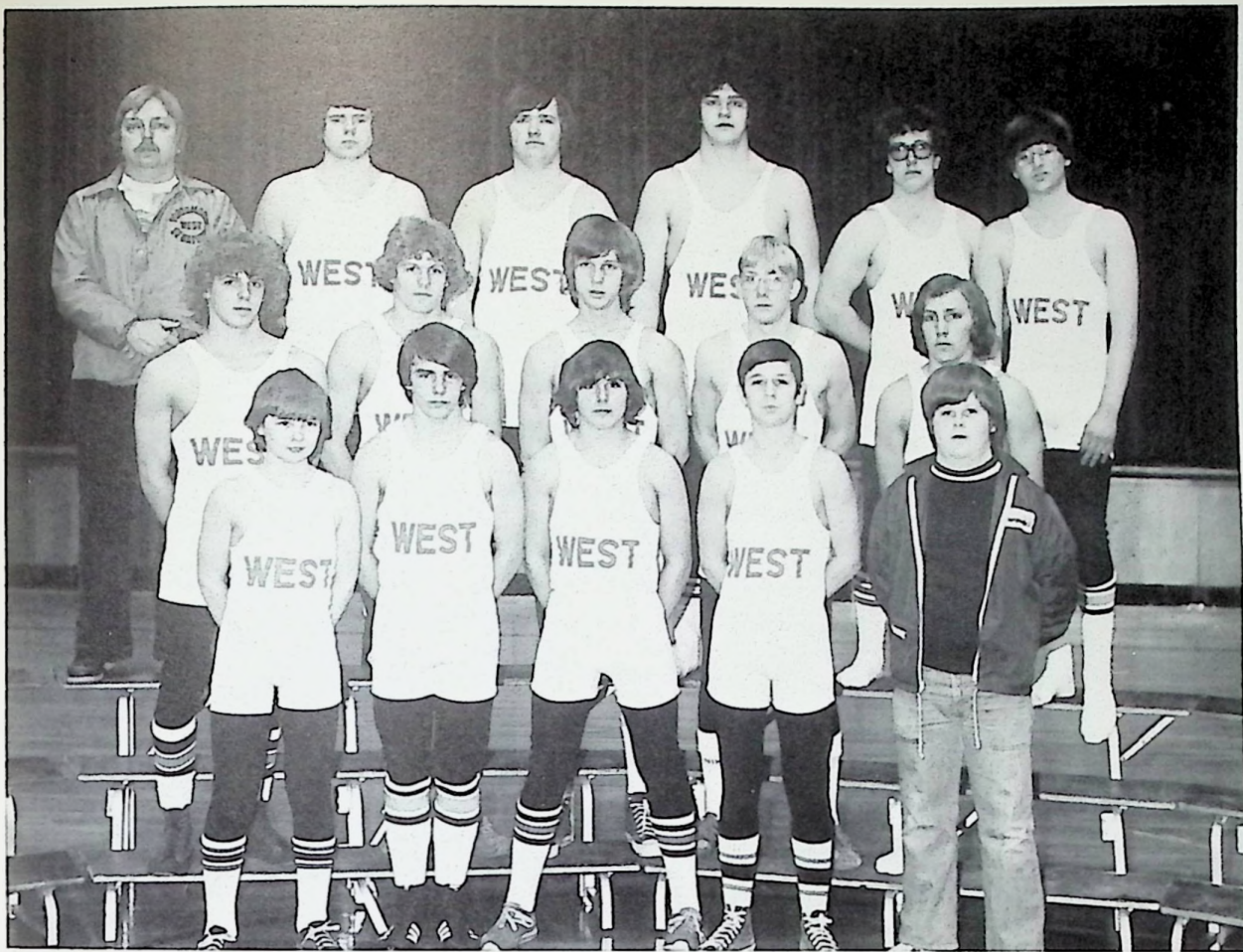
Winning Ways
