




Oct 1855-

Thursday, Oct. 7, 1893  
Another big frost  
The ground very wet  
Came looks bad  
Thicket frozen down  
If rain comes  
it will spoil  
lots of food  
Jens & I cut  
corn by moon  
light last night  
and cut corn  
until it  
gets too dark to  
cut, then, pull  
beans

Wed. Oct. 2  
Another big feast  
and still day  
Cut corn last  
night. untill  
midnight.

I finished  
today about  
8 P.M. then I  
helped Jenn  
cut corn & blood  
came. After dinner  
I finished  
pulling the beans  
and then helped  
in the care of  
corn.

Thurs. Oct. 3,  
A big feast  
cut corn till  
eleven last  
night & then  
this morning  
untill 6 o'clock  
to get.  
Smith finished  
cutting.  
Jennie & I worked  
at the corn.  
Pa went down  
to Ruth's and  
got a molasses  
barrel.

Thurs. Oct. 4.

A nice day  
Jens & I finished  
cutting over and  
all the cane  
and began to  
make molasses.  
Took the cane over  
to the mill.

I gathered in  
all the rest of  
my cane.

Jens & I are  
going to make  
molasses all  
night to night.

Sat. Oct. 5.

A nice day.  
No frost.  
Jens & I made  
molasses all night  
and until 2 P.M.  
and finished.  
The men thrashed  
beans the rest  
of the day.  
Tieft & the  
drawn.

Tues. Oct. 2  
The watered ear  
but failed.  
Spinkled a little  
ton night  
All waiting an  
ear to see what  
Glen & D. would do  
con.

After dinner we  
took the team  
wagon with  
us. to the miller  
patch and found  
a load down  
at night

Wed. Oct. 9  
A big frost  
The cut miller  
all day  
Gard in two  
loads.

Thurs. Oct 10  
A big report  
The mallet at  
dog. Smith  
helped me to  
get help in  
his.  
We hauled two  
more loads.

Fri. Oct. 11  
A heavy  
I stayed cool all  
day. The firm had  
cutting & bundling  
the mallet.  
Hauled in two  
more loads.  
Smith helped  
till now.  
He soaked his  
mallet up this  
afternoon.

Sat Oct. 12.  
A nice day.  
We packed the  
apples  
I helped  
Harper drill  
wheat.  
The present  
wheat that  
any of us has  
sowed this year.  
A fine rain  
began last  
night and  
mounted the  
ground much.  
But I went out  
with Lord and

Sun. Oct. 13.  
A heavy frost  
this morning.  
Dad not get  
up till late.  
Dad, Ma & Lila  
went up to  
visit R. L. W.  
Gena with  
Chapman boys.  
I went up to  
visit J. L. W.  
with Emma &  
Robert Davis.  
Had a good time  
had to be all the  
chasing at evening  
parting.

Mon. Oct. 14  
A big part  
Genie working  
at his new  
ground.

I started to  
dig potatoes  
but had to  
go and help  
pa drill wheat  
in corner plow  
with the idea  
to plow in  
in the spring  
He drilled 6 1/2  
acres.

Tue. Oct. 15  
A big part  
A nice day  
Looked a little  
like rain but  
failed  
Pa & Genie finished  
hauling in the  
millet.  
I drilled in  
over 7 acres of  
wheat today.

Wed. Oct. 16

A nice day

Big frost.

I drilled wheat  
about all day.

John working

but his wheat

is gone. Burning

is over.

The wind began  
to blow and

blowed the fire

across into the

penit. on the

ball. Burned up

several panels

of fence. but we

got it under control

Thurs. Oct. 17

A big frost.

I drilled all day

John fixed the

burned fence

up again

work a half day

to build it

Uncle Benson who

came down about

time. He went

down on the

crick.

I finished drilling

13 acres. Cross drilled

it.

Fri. Oct 18  
A big frost  
Still dry  
I helped Jimmie  
with his wheat  
all day  
Pa. went to  
mills at  
Thebes

Sat. Oct 19  
A nice day  
A cool wind  
The butcher had  
a calf  
Uncle Ben Noble,  
Uncle Phem & Daniel  
Lem Plutill came  
Bro. Barnick  
came down also  
He went up  
to church to  
hear his preach

Sun. Oct 20  
A cool day  
Went to the  
Lear, stayed all  
night for the  
first time.  
by on a visit  
to the all up to  
the church this  
afternoon and  
then at night  
Emma Shepard  
& I took a walk  
and went  
to the Switch  
after the meal.

Weds Oct 27  
A big frost  
Some ice frost  
I dug potatoes  
all day  
Barnick went  
home  
The thrasher man  
was absent  
I received a  
letter from John  
Hurtall

Thurs, Oct. 22

A big frost  
I dug potatoes  
and buried  
a lot of them  
I'm still  
wheat.

Frid. Oct. 23.

A big frost  
I started early  
and got ready  
to go to market  
John's finished  
his wheat.  
I helped him  
He had a good  
big load to  
take on market.

Thurs. Oct. 24

A pretty thin  
morning. I  
started at  
10 o'clock at  
midnight and  
arrived there about  
daylight.

A little market  
but only 20 cts  
for the chickens.  
The had ten dollars  
and some cents of  
marketing.

A lot of trading  
to do. At 11 o'clock  
I took the train  
for Hanerhill where

Fri. Oct. 25

A warm day  
with this morning  
I came down to  
Phillipsburg and  
walked out to the  
bluffs.

Got down and  
came on home  
where I arrived  
just in time to  
help feed and  
get ready for  
a public sale at  
Dunn Ch. The night  
the sheep and  
town coming back  
from Adams Ch.

Sat. Oct. 25

A. big frost  
and a nice day  
I fished around  
all day.

Went to get  
ready and drove  
over to Baker  
school at about  
a quarter of  
dark.

Chances are I will  
be there.

Sun. Oct. 27

A. damp morning  
and. Rained a  
delightfully day rain  
mostly in the  
day.

Bill & I drove  
down to church.  
Rabbi brought out  
gill net and  
we had a good  
time until Bill  
& I got ready to  
start for home.

As we started, Nancy  
got the wheel of my  
car and it broke  
broke it and I  
Bill. So I took home.

Mon. Oct. 28.

A big heavy  
cleared off  
last night  
I began to  
dig potatoes  
again  
Henry digging

milk for

up for cold  
weather.

Thurs. Oct 31,

A slow steady  
rain all night  
and all day

The most rain  
in some time

We found around  
I blacksmithed  
most of the after  
noon.

An odd year  
A pair of Chestnut  
pepper  
they all go  
to good

Tracywell  
October 31st
