PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

It is imperative that all pupils wishing to attend college study and learn to the maximum of their abilities. Colleges require entrance examinations and admission may not be acceptable if a deficiency is noted; if such deficiency is not made up, a pupil may be required to enroll in high school subjects without credit in college.

If a pupil develops proper study habits, has a good attitude, really wants to learn, takes a college preparatory course of study in high school and has average or above average intelligence, there is no reason why he could not attend college or go on to higher education and be successful.
