








Two senior members of the Portsmouth High School football team captured double awards at the recognition dinner held at the American Legion.


The most valuable player and the Gardener trophy were selected by vote of the players. The other honors were made by a vote by the Portsmouth High coaching staff.





TROJANS WIN 87-73 OVER LANCASTER PHS GYM DECEMBER 16, 1972





Rick McGlone was the only Trojan player in double figures. He finished with 13 pts.


MIDDLETOWN WINS 73-66 OVER TROJANS




