The library of Minford High School is a busy place during the three periods that it is open. Both magazines and books are widely read and used in various classes as regular assignments. There is a variety of magazines from which to choose: Time, Life, Look, Readers Digest, McCall's, Popular Mechanics, Ladies Home Journal, Newsweek, and many others. Available also is the ever popular and useful Readers Guide. Six hundred volumes have been added to the shelves this year. Grades 7 through 12 have assigned periods each week in which to use the library. The remainder of the time it is open to the study hall. Student librarians assist with much of the clerical work, and with the processing of new books for the shelves.

A new Compton's Encyclopedia was purchased this year and is in much demand by the students. With the addition of other new reference books such as: Twentieth Century Authors and Columbia Encyclopedia, the Minford Library is growing rapidly and becoming more up to date.

The classified section, containing those books which can be used for curriculum enrichmentin science, literature, and government, for instance--is stocked with helpful and interesting volumes. Our library is a growing and vital part of our school.
